All ballots must be received by mail or online no later than 10:00 AM PST on April 15, 2020. Ballots will not be accepted at the annual meeting.

VOTE ONE OF TWO WAYS:

- **1. VOTE ONLINE.** OPALCO offers secure electronic voting in partnership with Survey and Ballot Systems (SBS). This is the preferred method of voting.
- 2. VOTE BY US MAIL. See the enclosed ballot for instructions. Be sure to SIGN THE FRONT OF YOUR REPLY ENVELOPE. Without your signature, your vote will not count.

WHO GETS TO VOTE?

Each *membership* gets one vote, no matter how many meters are attached to the membership, regardless of how many people are named on the membership.

HOW MANY CANDIDATES CAN WE VOTE FOR?

Each member may select TWO Board candidates for two open positions in District 1. Vote in every election regardless of your home district.

WHY VOTE?

OPALCO members are owners of their electric cooperative. You have the power to elect your Co-op Board of Directors who set the rates and make the policies.

How do you Prefer to Receive Your Ballot?

Many of you have already opted out of paper ballots - thank you! For those who are still getting a paper ballot in the mail, there is a place on the ballot to opt out of paper for next year. This is a big cost savings for the Co-op and helps us to limit our carbon impact. A valid email address is essential for voting online. VINCE DAUCIUNAS



Vince Dauciunas and his wife Vikky have been residents of San Juan Island since 2002.

I currently serve as the President of the OPALCO Board of Directors, and am seeking my fourth term. I served for 14 years on the Board of Directors of the Friday Harbor Animal Shelter.

My education includes Bachelors and Masters Degrees in Electrical Engineering from Notre

Dame and UC Berkeley. I am a member of the IEEE Power and Energy Group.

After working at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory, I spent 26 years with Hewlett Packard and Agilent Technologies in Research and Development, General Management, and Business Development.

My experience includes development of systems for measurement, computation and communication in a wide variety of industries, including Power Generation, Telecommunications, Environmental Science, Water Quality, and Biotechnology. I was responsible for Strategic Planning in the Chemical and Life Sciences Group, which has grown to be a \$5 billion per year business today.

In my last position, I was Vice President at Symyx Technologies; a company focused on discovering new materials for use in many areas, including fuel cells, advanced batteries, and renewable fuels.

I first joined the Board in 2011. In the past nine years, the OPALCO team has accomplished a number of significant achievements, including the implementation of a vastly improved broadband communications infrastructure through Rock Island, the county's first community solar project, and continuous improvement of our electrical grid. And, OPALCO is taking a leadership position with respect to meeting the challenges of a rapidly evolving energy future, including renewable generation and storage, energy conservation, de-carbonization of our transportation systems, and assuring a safe, reliable, sustainable, and affordable power supply.
